



ABOUT NORTH SOMERSET

North Somerset's opportunities for business investment and innovation together with natural assets and the culture and heritage scene make it a place where people want to live, work, and visit.

The area of North Somerset is made up of Weston-super-Mare, Clevedon, Portishead and Nailsea, ranging from coastal towns to small inner villages. Our region has some wonderful natural assets including part of the Mendip Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, 39 sites of Special Scientific Interest, and 25 miles of coastline. The region is well-connected with close proximity to Bristol airport and direct trains to Bristol, Cardiff, Bath Spa, and London.

North Somerset is home to 215,100 people and over 8,000 businesses. It's constantly growing, with a projected population increase of 16% by 2041. Within North Somerset there is focus on maintaining the green infrastructure, such as woodlands and public parks, and a strong commitment to become carbon neutral by 2030 to fight against the global climate emergency.

WHAT OUR GRADUATES HAVE SAID

As the district with the third greatest inequality gap in England, North Somerset has provided a very dynamic and uniquely challenging setting in which to start my career. As a more rural area that still has some large towns, the experience of working here is incredibly varied and provides constant learning opportunities that you wouldn't be exposed to elsewhere.

Since the start of my first placement, I have had opportunities to take on considerable responsibility and have autonomy over how my projects are run. In my first six months in the public health team, I was able to lead on commissioning a mental health service from start to finish, co-produce and run focus groups with children's centres in the community, coordinate and deliver a community grants programme, and contribute to overarching strategy and research.

I have also had lots of exposure to senior managers within the council and been able to sit in on high-level meetings, as well as having shadowing opportunities with elected members. The Chief Executive of North Somerset is very supportive of and engaged in the scheme, which means we as graduates are supported and enabled in our career development.

I joined North Somerset Council in September 2021 as part of its first ever NGDP cohort. I'm now in my seventh month, and I've already enjoyed a wealth of opportunities.

My first placement was in Housing where I primarily worked on the new five-year Housing Strategy, including research, consultation, writing, and design. I was also heavily involved in launching the council's pursuit of DAHA accreditation, which centres around ensuring an organisation implements best practice in its approach to domestic abuse and housing.

I have recently started my second placement in Development and Placemaking, specifically working on the development and climate emergency side. It is early days, but projects have emerged around areas including consultation on new land development and the procurement of solar panels for council properties.

Although there was some risk in joining a council new to the NGDP process, they have made every effort to ensure I get the experience needed to succeed as a future leader. I am invited to senior meetings, have 1-1s with the Chief Executive Officer, get to interact with and brief elected members, and am given the chance to involve myself in wider council areas and projects, including electoral services and the creation of a Project Management Office. My fellow graduate and I are also setting up a Youth Forum to represent the voices of young people in the council.

North Somerset Council is keen to invest in its future workforce, and it is doing all it can to make sure we feel valued and gain useful experience. There are a lot of ambitious projects happening in the district, and I would highly recommend joining us at this exciting time.
